MEMBERSHIP POLICY

1. John Knox Christian School Society recognizes two types of membership, namely full membership and associate membership.
2. Any person or family wishing to become a full member of the John Knox Christian School Society must declare that they are in full agreement with the statements of Purpose and Basis as outlined in the Constitution and By-Laws booklet.
3. As a full member of the John Knox Christian School Society they promise to accept the obligations of the Society which include paying the annual membership fee as approved by the membership currently set at \$480.00 annually. The membership is included in the tuition. All fees are due within 30 days of acceptance and can be mailed to the treasurer or the school. Notice of membership due will be sent out in the fall of each year.
4. Full membership includes the following privileges:
 - a. Voting at membership meetings of the John Knox Christian School Society. (with husband and wife each having one vote.)
 - b. Participating in school activities.
 - c. Being eligible to serve on the board of J.K.C.S. and all committees of the board of J.K.C.S.
 - d. Voting at membership meetings of L.D.C.S.S. and serving on the board and committees of L.D.C.S.S.
5. Acceptance or rejection of application for full membership in the Society is made by the Board of Directors and applicants are promptly informed of the board's decision.
6. The full membership, with its obligations and privileges, continues until such time when the board:
 - a. Receives a signed written resignation.
 - b. Non-constitutional action by the member.
 - c. Non-payment of the annual fee.
7. Associate members do not have a vote at society meetings and may not serve on the Board, the Human Resources Committee, the Program Committee, The Membership Committee or the Admissions Committee. Any persons with children in attendance at John Knox Christian School and paying tuition who do not wish to become full members will be deemed Associate Members.
8. Donors: Any individual, society, institution or organization, may become a donor of this society. Donors may be represented but have no vote at the society's meeting.
